ORDINANCE NO. 2012-0004

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING UNION GROVE CEMETERY VETERAN'S

MEMORIAL COMMITTEE TO HOLD VOLUNTEER FUNDS

The Town Board of the Town of Cassian, Oneida County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I – PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY.

This Ordinance is enacted by the Cassian Town Board pursuant to the specific authority under Section 66.0608, Wis. Stats. The purpose of this ordinance is to authorize the Union Grove Cemetery Veterans Memorial Committee to hold "volunteer funds" in the name of the Committee.

SECTION II – ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE.

This Ordinance, adopted by a majority of the Town Board on roll call vote with a quorum present and voting and proper notice having been given, authorizes the Committee's Treasurer to hold volunteer funds in the name of the Committee as provided in this Ordinance.

SECTION III – DEFINITIONS.

In this Ordinance:

A. "Public depository" means a federal or state credit union, federal or state savings and loan association, state bank, savings and trust company, federal or state savings bank, or national bank in this state that receives or holds any public deposits or the local government pooled-investment fund.

B. "Volunteer funds" means funds of a municipality that are raised by employees of the Union Grove Cemetery Veterans Memorial Committee, by volunteers, or by donation to the Committee for the benefit of the Union Grove Cemetery.

SECTION IV – ACCOUNTS.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit volunteer funds of the Committee in an account in the name of the Committee in a public depository designated by the Town Board. The Committee, through its Treasurer, shall have exclusive control over the expenditure of volunteer funds of the Committee, subject to Section V.

SECTION V - LIMITATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS.

The following limitations and requirements shall apply to the handling and disbursement of funds from the public depository account:

A. Expenditures withdrawn from the public depository account may be made only upon majority vote of the Committee's members present at a duly noticed meeting of the Committee. Such withdrawals and expenditures may be made for any purpose that promotes the ability of the Committee to provide service for which it was organized.

B. Accountings. The Committee Treasurer and Chairperson shall provide the Town Board with an annual statement in December of each calendar year. The statement shall include a detailed itemization of all receipts, expenditures, and balance on hand at the end of the year. The source of all funds and the identity of the payee for each disbursement shall be set forth.

C. Audit. The Committee's accounts shall be included in the annual audit of the Town's funds and shall be audited in the same manner as other Town funds.

SECTION VI - SEVERABILITY.

If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of this ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

SECTION VII – EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance is effective upon posting in three public places within the Town..

The Town Clerk shall properly post or publish this Ordinance as required under Section


60.80, Wis. Stats.


